











Location: Upper Priest River, Kaniksu National Forest, Exposed slope Boulder Creek - taken from opposite slope. Note that the near slope shows a heavy stand or reproduction while the opposite is very sparsely stocked. The rock on the opposite slope is visible. Note that three reproduction groups exist. These will act as seed centers for the total reproduction of the area. Two fires ran over the slope but left the two reproduction groups.



Southeast aspect on Boulder Creek showing occasional seed trees chiefly on the ridge top, left by the first fire and killing of reproduction, except groups, by the second fire. These groups are now bearing seed and will eventually restock the whole slope. Detail of young stand on Fig. 10 shown in foreground.
